## **Message from the President**

Dear ACPSS friends,

While the cheerful atmosphere and the happy gathering at our 18<sup>th</sup> international conference at the University of Pittsburgh are still lingering in our minds, the beautiful city of Louisville is stretching out both its arms to welcome the presenters and participants of our next conference. The 19<sup>th</sup> ACPSS International Conference will be held, in collaboration with the Asian Studies Program of the University of Louisville and United Societies of China Studies (USCS), from November 1 to 3, 2013 in downtown Louisville, a scenic US mid-western city on the Kentucky side of the Ohio River. The conference theme is “The Impacts of Leadership Transition in China: Domestic and International Concerns.” Submissions of panels and papers in both English and Chinese are cordially welcomed.

We’ll have three extra tasks during the coming conference. First, we’ll elect a new ACPSS president and a new ACPSS board to serve the next term. Secondly, we’ll announce the winner(s) of the 2013 ACPSS Outstanding Community Service Award. Thirdly, we’ll award up to 6 ACPSS members for their excellence in scholarly publication. The election committee is formed by Professors Aiguo



Han (Chair), Liyan Liu and Ronghua Ouyang. A call for nomination will be issued in May. The 2013 ACPSS Outstanding Committee Service Award Committee includes Professors Patrick Shan (Chair), Jingyi Song and Xiansheng Tian. Nomination and/or self-nomination should be submitted to the committee by August 1, 2013. Professors Jieli Li (Chair), Shiping Hua and Liren Zheng have formed the 2013 ACPSS Publication Award Committee. All active ACPSS members are eligible for nomination and/or self-nomination. The deadline for nomination is July 1, 2013.

This summer, ACPSS will hold a joint international conference with a Chinese university first time in its 19 years of history. Our partner is Xi’an International Studies University (XISU). The joint international conference, with the theme of “China and Globalization in the 21<sup>st</sup> Century: Domestic and International Challenges,” will be held from June 7 to 9, 2013 on XISU campus, Xi’an, China. Over 20 ACPSS members from the United States will go to Xi’an to attend and present at the conference, and two of them will deliver keynote speeches for the conference. During the summer, two groups of ACPSS members from the United States will be invited to lecture at some universities in Ningxia and Hainan respectively. We hope these kinds of academic exchange and cooperation activities will grow in terms of scale and location next year and in future. All the ACPSS members, old and new, are expected to initiate and be involved in more of such events and activities. Let’s work together to make ACPSS an even stronger academic organization.
