As the term of the current editor-in-chief is ending, the ACPSS board is seeking applications for a new editor-in-chief position of its official journal *American Review of China Studies* (ARCS at [arcs-journal.org](http://arcs-journal.org)). Founded in 2000, ARCS is a peer-reviewed scholarly journal, published twice a year (in Spring and Fall). The primary role of the editor-in-chief is to take full responsibility of the routine editorial work and fund raising, which include, but not limited to, seeking adequate funding to sustain the journal’s editorial operation and its website updates, managing manuscript submission, soliciting peer reviewers, coordinating with the press for book reviews, securing a professional graphic and print workshop for journal’s publication, and distributing the new issues via mail or email.

The qualification of applicant: The candidate should hold a doctorate degree, be a professor or an associate professor at an American college or university, be a registered (or to be registered) ACPSS member and have a record of publishing

scholarly works on China related issues. It is imperative that the candidate make a full commitment to the editor's job in terms of ensuring the publication of each issue on time and being willing to utilize his or her own institution's resources to serve the needs of journal.
