Dr. Jieli Li, Professor of Sociology from Ohio University, Athens, has published a book 《国家盛衰的地缘政治论 - 历史比较社会学视角》, by City University of Hong Kong Press, 2022.

A team of researchers led by Cambridge Professor of Emerita David P. Farrington published their study in *Asian Journal of Criminology* (2022, 17:193–212) that ranked scholars' number of citations in five top criminology journals between 2006 and 2020. ACPSS member Professor Cao, Liqun is listed as No. 9 in the most recent ranking 2016–2020 (see Table 7). He is the only non-English speaker with a distinctive Chinese name who

made the top ten list. The five journals of criminology are *Asian Journal of Criminology* (AJC), *Journal of Criminology* (formerly *Australia and New Zealand Journal of Criminology*), *British Journal of Criminology*, *Canadian Journal of Criminology and Criminal Justice*, and *Criminology* (by American Society of Criminology). Professor Cao is known for his research in criminological theory, police legitimacy, and race and ethnicity in criminal justice. 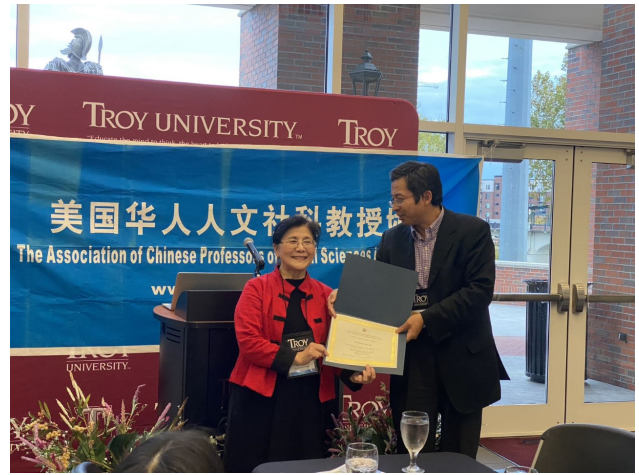

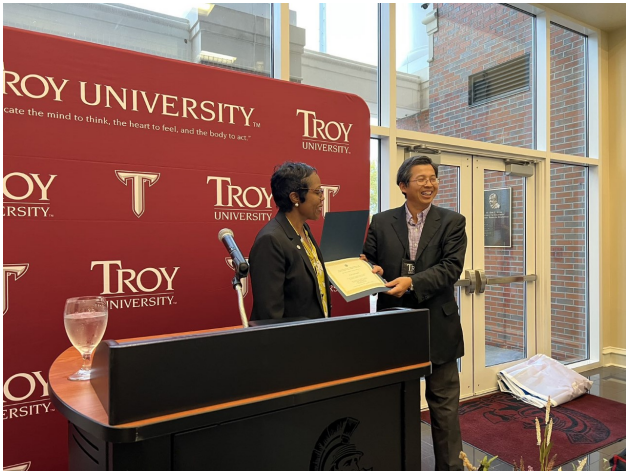

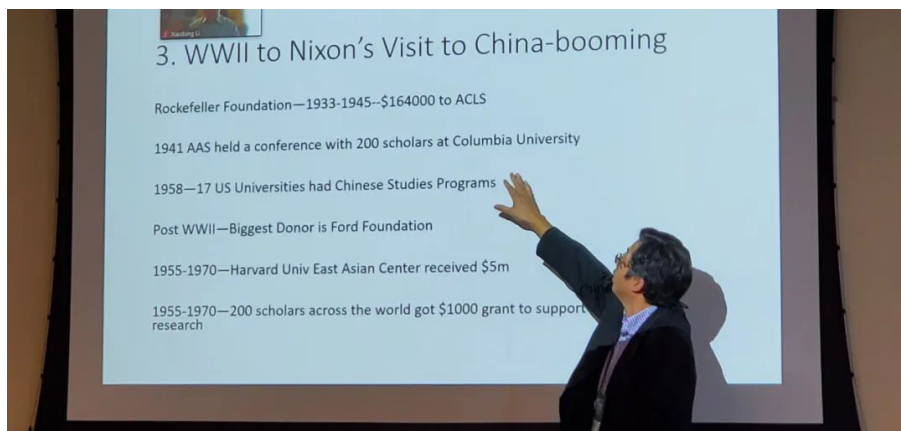
【记者报道】10月28-30日，“变动世界格局中的中华民族复兴”国际学术研讨会暨美国华人人文社科教授协会第27届国际年会在美国特洛伊大学（Troy University）顺利召开。



主办方美国华人人文社科教授协会（The Association of Chinese Professors of Social Sciences in the United States, ACPSS）是主要由社会学科和人文学科两大研究领域内的北美华人教授组成的独立非盈利学术组织。目前拥有500多名注册会员，学术研究涵盖政治学、经济学、社会学、哲学、法律、历史、宗教、教育、传播、人类学、考古学、文学、艺术、音乐学、心理学、地理学、语言学、图书馆学、公共管理、妇女研究等专业方向。自1995年成立以来，该协会致力于促进和保护目前任职于北美学术机构的人文社科华人学者的权益，鼓励两大领域内的跨学科研究工作与学术资源共享，推动北美和亚洲国家与地区的学术交流，共同促进人文社会科学领域的高等教育持续发展。

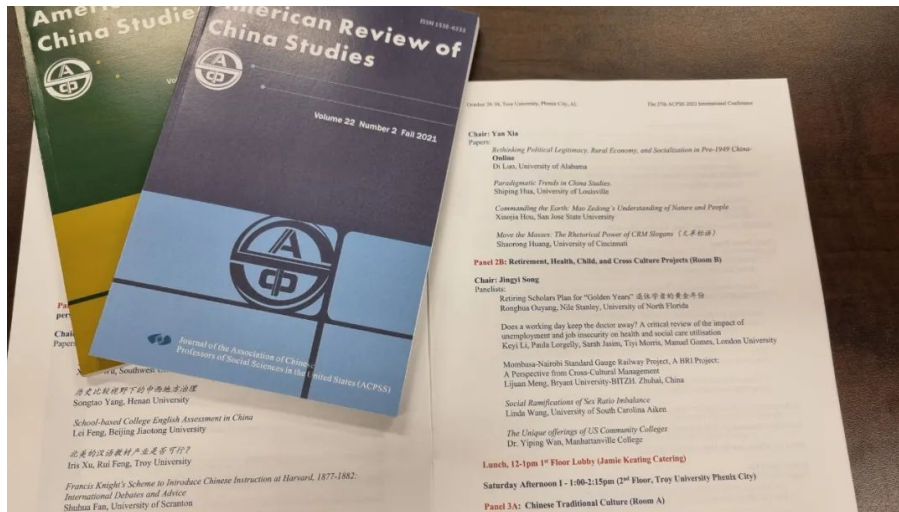

承办此次国际研讨会的美国特洛伊大学始建于1887年，位于阿拉巴马州的特洛伊市，为美国东南部的顶级公立综合性大学之一。本次研讨会假该校的凤凰城分校召开，该校副校长Dionne Rosser-Mims博士在研讨会开幕式上致欢迎辞。ACPSS现任会长，明尼苏达大学德卢斯分校历史系教授方强博士随后发表讲话，代表协会和参会学者，感谢东道主的盛情，特别提到该校的徐弘教授及其团队成员，感谢他们的积极推动与大力襄助，使本届年会得以顺利召开。

中美关系是当前世界上最重要又极端复杂的议题，不仅牵涉到两国各个层面的重要事务，也影响到全球国际事务各方面的未来发展。开幕式结束后，俄克拉荷马州中部大学历史学教授李小兵博士，美国“卡特中心”中国项目主任刘亚伟博士，路易斯安那州立大学人类地理学教授王法辉博士围绕“疫情期间中美关系动态”的主题，展开此次研讨会的主旨对话。
